THE MANAGEMENT

Fr. Christy Madathil is the Asst. Executive Director.

CURRICULUM

The School follows the curriculum and syllabi of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi. The students are prepared for Secondary School Examination (SSE) & Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (SSCE). Examinations take place at the end of grades X & XII. The medium of instruction is English. Hindi and Malayalam are the additional languages being taught.

ADMISSION

The LKG is open to children aged 4 as on the 1st of June of the year of admission. Attested copies of the child's birth and vaccination certificates should be submitted. The correct date of birth and name must be written in the application for admission. The registration forms are issued at the beginning of August for the succeeding academic session. There will not be any interview for admission to LKG, other than a counselling session held for both parents and the child seeking admission.

To other classes admission will be subject to the availability of seats.

Pupils coming from other schools are required to bring their transfer certificates from the school last attended, duly attested by the D.E.O. or by the Regional Office, CBSE, if from another state or country according to CBSE stipulations.

The school authorities reserve the right to refuse admission to a pupil without assigning any reason. They also reserve the right to dismiss students whose diligence or progress in studies is constantly unsatisfactory or whose conduct is harmful to other students or whose parents show little interest in the progress of their wards.

WITHDRAWALS

- * A month's notice in writing is required for the withdrawal of a pupil.
- * Transfer Certificates will be given only to those who have paid the fees and other dues.
- * If a pupil is found unfit to continue in the school he/she will be removed from the rolls. Misbehaviour, cruelty towards other students, irregular attendance, disrespect to teachers, habitual idleness, stealing, improper conduct, etc are sufficient reasons for the dismissal of a pupil.
- * The school reserves the right to dismiss students whose fees and other financial dues are not paid in time.

ATTENDANCE

We stress the importance of regular attendance at the school. Ensure that your child is regular and punctual. No pupil shall be absent by himself/herself without prior permission. For unforeseen reasons, the reason for leave shall be documented in the School handbook on the first day of return to the school.

- * Continuous absence for 15 working days without a genuine reason renders students liable to be removed from the rolls.

- * Prior permission must be taken from the Principal for leave for more than 3 days.
- * The school does not encourage children to be taken early or brought late to the school.
- * Half-a-day leave will not be granted to pupils unless requested by parents in case of a genuine emergency of medical reasons or death in the family. In such instances the matter has to be informed to the Principal.
- * A minimum of 80% of the total working days of the academic year is a pre-requisite for promotion.
- * Attendance on the dates of opening and closing of the school is compulsory.

FEES

1. All the school fees are due in advance and should be paid in three installments on or before the **10th day of May, September and January**.
2. Fees can also be paid in one installment for the whole year in advance. Payment of fees can be made through any branch of **The Federal Bank** using the challan slips provided from the school by mentioning the Admission Number of the student.
Online payment of fees can be done through our website **www.naipunnya.edu.in/**
Mobile App
3. Fine of Rs. 5 will be collected per day for the next ten days after the due date. (upto 20th) Bank will accept fees after 20th of the particular month with a fine of Rs 100/-. Non-payment of fees even after the particular month will lead to removal of the student from the rolls. If the assigned date is a bank holiday, fees could be remitted on the following working day.
4. All school fees dues of the year must be cleared before a pupil is permitted to sit for the final examination.
5. The receipts issued by the school office/bank for the payment of school fees, bus fees, etc should be preserved and produced whenever they are asked for.

LIBRARY

- * Books from the school library will be issued to students only during the long recess and during the library hours fixed for each class.
- * Books for reference can be obtained from the librarian during the library hours. These books cannot be taken out of the library.
- * Perfect silence and order must be maintained in the library.
- * Periodicals and newspapers should not be taken out of the reading room.
- * All the books, before they are taken out of the library must be entered in the Library Issue Register.
- * Books are issued only for the use of the borrower. Hence he/she may not exchange them or lend them to others.
- * Books must be examined by the borrower before he/she leaves the library and must point out to the librarian if any damage is observed or else he/she may be held responsible for it.
- * Books may not be kept for more than a week. They may however be extended for another week, provided the book is overdue.
- * In case of damage or loss of a book, the student will have to make good the loss or damage as assessed by the librarian, normally the cost of the book and fine. In the event of one volume of a set being lost, the whole set will have to be replaced.

- * All the library books must be returned before the terminal or final examination, failing which the pupil may not be allowed to appear for the exams. All books should be returned before 10th of March, the day fixed for stock taking.
- * Pupils should maintain a record of all the library books they have read during the year.

SCHOOL PARLIAMENT

The School Parliament is intended to inculcate democratic values in pupils. It also gives ample scope for self expression, evaluation and judgment. It consists of School Leader, assistant School Leader, General Captain, Asst. General Captain, Captains and Vice Captains of the four houses.

TRANSPORTATION

The school buses ply in selected routes. Students are to board and alight from the buses at the fixed boarding points. Bus fees are to be paid in advance before the **10th of every month**. Students who opt for the school bus transportation have to avail the facility throughout the academic year. The tendency of opting for school buses only during the monsoon is not permissible.

The bus charges vary according to the distances. Vehicle charges should be paid in advance for each month. Parents have to make necessary arrangements to hand over and to take back their children at scheduled bus stops. If the school authorities are unable to run the bus, parents have to make their own arrangements to send their children to the school.

The school will not provide alternative transport facilities to students who miss the bus. While waiting for the bus, students should be mindful of good manners and exemplary behaviour.

The Management, Principal and staff will not be held responsible in any way for any accident or mishap that may occur to the student outside school premises while bringing the students to the school or taking them back.

PRIVATE TRANSPORT

Students who come to the school by private vehicles / auto rickshaws are to enter the school at Gate No. 2. No student passenger vehicle is meant to stop or park near Gate No.1, nor it is permitted for students to alight at the front gate.

Overcrowding in the autos is a punishable offence and is dangerous. Not more than six students are expected to travel in a student carrier auto. Violation of this rule is a public offence.

Vehicles other than the school transport system will not be allowed to enter the school campus. This is in the interest of the safety of your child.

ACCIDENTS

All precautions are taken to protect children from accidents while playing. However in the event of any mishap, the school does not accept legal responsibility. Immediate first aid will be administered and the pupil involved will be taken to the nearest medical facility if necessary and the same will be intimated to the parents

HEALTH CARE

Nurse in charge of students would take care of the sick room. First aid is given at the school to deal with bumps and bruises, aches and pains, coughs and sniffles. The student may avail of the Sick Room in such cases. However we would contact the parent/guardian if the child needs more medical attention and needs to go home early. If the student needs to carry medication to the school please see that a note with regard to the same is entered into the School handbook without fail. Students are entitled for medical insurance for minor injuries at school.

VISITING HOURS

The school does not encourage the parents to meet their wards during the school hours. However parents may meet the teachers on all fridays from 3.30 pm to 4.30 p.m. The parents will be called after each semester to have a discussion with the class teachers of their wards. The parents may not meet the teachers directly in

the class room/staff room or the lobbies. In case of an emergency, the parents must get permission from the Principal to meet the teachers. Consultation with the Principal may be had from 2-30 to 3-30 p.m on all working days or any other time with prior appointment.

SCHOOL RULES

1. The management sees to it that each pupil imbibes the spirit of discipline, as a habit of the mind and not by external compulsion. Naipunnya expects each student to uphold the school's values imbibed at the school, not only during their school years but also throughout their life. The spirit of Naipunnya is to be reflected through such values. Parents are requested to co-operate in the working of the school by enforcing regularity, punctuality and discipline and by taking interest in their ward's progress.
2. Every pupil shall endeavour to keep up the high standard and morale of the school by excelling in studies, manners and deportment.
3. Students must be well dressed in clean and full uniform with **clear socks** and **well polished shoes**.
4. Punctuality is the key to success. Pupils should be present in the school, before the first bell for commencement of classes. Latecomers should meet the Principal and their names must be entered in the late coming record.
5. Pupils should not move about at the time of prayer and National Anthem. They shall observe strict silence at the assembly.
6. At the first bell, the students as well as the staff shall assemble in the quadrangle of the school accompanied by the class teachers in the class order. On dispersal the pupils will move to their own classrooms in the same order.
7. When the teacher enters the classroom, all the pupils should stand up, greet him/her and remain standing until they are asked to sit down. All shall remain silent and study till the teacher comes to the class. In the absence of the teacher, the class leader assumes the responsibility for the order and discipline of the class.
8. No pupil shall enter other classrooms without permission. Pupils may change their allotted seats in the class room **ONLY** with the permission of the class teacher.

9. Running or playing about or shouting inside the classrooms or corridors is not allowed. While passing along the corridors and quadrangles during school hours, pupils shall keep perfect silence. No shouting or whistling is allowed in the class rooms. No student shall disturb another class at work on the flimsy plea of taking a pen, pencil or book on loan from his friend.
10. All books must be kept clean and well labelled. No drawings, pictures, photograph or scribbling will be accepted on any part of any text book and exercise book. The offenders at their own expense will replace books, files and any school property defaced in this way or destroyed.
11. Pupils should be polite and courteous and greet their teachers, elders and respect persons when they meet them.
12. Students are expected to speak only English in the school campus and in the school bus (except in Malayalam and Hindi language classes). Every student must take pride in conversing in English. Any pupil found conversing in any other vernacular will be subject to face disciplinary actions.
13. Perfect silence is to be observed in the laboratory and library.
14. Every pupil is responsible for the safe keeping of his/her belongings.
15. All the books and articles of pupils must bear their name.
16. Gold ornaments, jewellery and costly articles are not to be brought to the school under any circumstances.
17. Playing cards, toys, tattoos, CDs, mobile phones, cameras, video games, chewing gum, whistler, fire crackers, periodicals etc should not be brought to school.
18. Wrist watches (not too expensive and matching size) are allowed only for students of Std V and above. They are not to be removed during the school hours. Smart watches are not permitted.
19. No student can leave the school premises during the school hours without the Principal's permission. They need to avail the gate pass from the Principal/ Vice-Principal.
20. Habitual negligence in work, disobedience, acts of misconduct will involve severe disciplinary action including expulsion.
21. Any damage caused to the property of the school will have to be made good.
22. Pupils should realize that they are responsible to the school authorities for their conduct both in and outside the school. Hence misbehaviour in public streets and conveyances are sufficient for the dismissal of the students.

23. Celebration of any special days like birthdays should be treated as a simple affair. Students are permitted to wear colour dress, strictly formal one which aligns with the school decorum. Students may distribute simple chocolates to their classmates, if they so desire. No cutting of cakes/distribution of sweets or gifts are permitted, any violation will be considered to be a wilful violation and will be dealt with strictly. Students may contribute an amount to the school charity fund.
24. The School counsellor is available during the school hours. In the event of any academic or emotional stress, you may contact the counsellor through the class teacher.
25. Students allotted with responsibilities like members of school parliament and prefects should be a role model in their overall behaviour and wear their respective badges daily.
26. As a Naipunnyan, shouting or whistling is certainly not a desirable practice, within or outside the campus and in the school bus.
27. Bringing fireworks/explosives or splashing colour/mobiles/iPods/pen drives/CDs etc in school premise is strictly forbidden. Non-compliance of this instruction can result in expulsion from the school.
28. The principal/management has the right to introduce, amend or change the rules and regulations whenever necessary in furtherance of the aims and objectives of the school.
29. Since the handbook is prepared at the beginning of the year, minor changes in dates and timings may sometimes have to be effected. The same will be communicated through the handbook

STUDENT DRESS CODE

Ensure that your child comes to the school neatly dressed and maintains the dress code prescribed to them. The school uniform is obligatory on all school days and at official school functions unless otherwise indicated. Pupils should take special care to keep their uniform clean and smart at all time. Shoes must be clean and neatly polished. Girls and boys should wear the prescribed black laced shoes and the school socks.

Girls (1-IV) are to have their hair trimmed properly to the shoulder level. Girls (V-VIII) may grow their hair, but should wear it as a pony tail and held in place with a hair band that should match their general dressing. Other girls (IX-XII) may grow their hair, but should wear it as a pony tail. Fancy hair clips and accessories are not allowed.

Girls are not allowed to colour their hair, grow/varnish their nails or do any kind of tattooing. Using bindi is also not allowed. Boys must have their hair neatly cut from time to time (no fancy cuts).

Girls (I - V) must wear bloomers and slips as part of their uniform. Gold and other ornaments are not permitted except a small ear stud for girls.

If any child comes in improper uniform, it will be dealt with a warning and later with disciplinary action. Fine may be enforced in the case of regular defaulters.

On the day that students are permitted to wear casual clothes do ensure that they are suitably attired for school. Dress and deportment speak volumes for the student and the institution.

Regular Days: Half sleeved Grey shirt, Grey shorts, School Tie, School Belt, Grey Socks & Black Shoes.

Wednesdays: Half sleeved Cream shirt, Biscuit colour shorts, School Belt, Biscuit Shade Socks, Black Shoes and School Tie.

Classes: V – XII (BOYS)

Regular Days: Half sleeved Grey shirt, Grey Pants, School Tie, School Belt, Grey Socks & Black Shoes.

Wednesdays: Half sleeved Cream shirt, Biscuit colour Pants, School Belt, Biscuit Shade Socks, Black Shoes and School Tie.

Classes: I – V (GIRLS)

Regular Days: Half sleeved Grey shirt, Box pleated check pinafore, Maroon Loop Tie, School belt, Black cloth hair band, Grey socks & Black shoes.

Wednesdays: Half sleeved Cream shirt, Box pleated Biscuit colour Pinafore, Biscuit colour Loop Tie, School Belt, Black cloth hair band, Biscuit shade socks & Black shoes.

Classes: VI- XII (GIRLS)

Regular Days: Half sleeved Grey shirt, Grey Pants, Grey colour jacket, School Tie, Black bands for pony tail (students with short hair - Black cloth hair band), Grey socks & Black shoes.

Wednesdays: Cream $\frac{3}{4}$ sleeved shirt, Biscuit colour Pants, Biscuit colour jacket, Black band for pony tail (students with short hair - Black cloth hair band), Biscuit shade socks, Black shoes and School Tie.

NB:

1. The shoes should be as prescribed by the school (Class LKG to II Model No: Odysia CL 2013, Class III to XII Model No: Odysia CL-3011).
2. Students of Grade 1 to V should wear long leg socks, and students of grade VI to XII should wear ankle socks.
3. Footwear for monsoon (June & July) Black sandal with black straps for boys & girls.
4. Boys and Girls of classes XI & XII are to wear School Tie with Yellow stripes every day.

RECOMMENDATION TO PARENTS

1. Parents should check the school hand book every evening. Remarks made in the school hand book by the principal/ teacher should be taken note of and counter signed. Besides the school calendar, circulars with serial numbers and dates issued from time to time to the parents to keep them informed of the school's programme.
2. The school contact number should be used in case of emergency, please abstain from the habit of making petty enquiries.
3. Parents are advised not to grant any money to the students, as any monetary transaction is strictly prohibited.
4. Parents/guardians/visitors/drivers are not expected to enter the classroom or speak to teachers during the class hours. The teachers will be available to the parents for consultation on all Fridays from 3.30 p.m. to 4.30 p.m.
5. No vehicle will be allowed to enter the school compound during school hours.
6. Parents are advised to educate their wards to respect civic rules by not allowing minors to drive two wheelers like motor bikes/heavy vehicles.
7. Name and class should be clearly labelled on student's belongings. Lost and found articles will be kept in the office and should be claimed by the child.
8. Students who fail to show the remarks/ test report and get them countersigned by their parents are liable to be sent home.
9. Changes in the address or telephone numbers of parents/guardians must be intimated to the school, failing which the school will not be responsible for the non-receipt of communication.
10. Parents are requested to ensure that their wards carry the text/exercise books according to the timetable of the day, absence of which adds excess weight and harms the spine of the child.
11. Please meet the Principal or a teacher whenever you receive a note or a phone call regarding your ward's problem.
12. Should there be any legitimate complaint, do not hesitate to meet the Principal at once for personal intervention.
13. Criticism of the teacher or the institution in the presence of their children should be scrupulously avoided because it may cause loss of respect to their teacher as well as the School, further retard his progress.
14. Payment of fees is the responsibility of the parents and it should be paid in time.
15. We expect you to attend all **parent-teacher meetings**. This is your opportunity to help us to improve.
16. Parents are requested to instil the habits of sending home-made foods in their lunch boxes. Junk food is totally prohibited in the School. On Fridays students are expected to bring only Vegetarian food.
17. Children should be escorted to and from school by parents or persons authorized by them.

Before you sit a test/exam you must be prepared

- **Know the format**
- Multiple choice?
- Essays?
- Short answer?
- **Know the time available**
- Have the subject matter efficiently summarised under:
 - heading
 - key words
 - main points
 - plans of attack for Maths/Science problems.
- **Test** your knowledge and understanding with friends and family :
 - Discuss, justify, explain concepts
 - Question each other
 - Identify weaknesses and rectify them.

Be **systematic**

- plan your study
- put up posters at home with key information
- never just read when revising; take notes.

Draw mind maps

- try to see where it all fits in the “ big picture”

SITTING FOR TESTS/EXAMS

Being able to **demonstrate** your knowledge and understanding under test conditions is essential.

“**Freezing**” and “ **forgetting everything** ” during tests or exams is often caused by:

- lack of preparation
- poor understanding
- a revision that is not well organized
- not storing the information systematically in your brain.
- Not understanding the exam questions.

When sitting for tests/exams:

- Read the questions carefully
- Begin with the ones that you can do immediately; this will give you confidence
- Divide the number of marks into the time so that you know how long to spend on each question
- Always be positive with a “ can do” attitude; it will stimulate your memory
- Never leave an exam early; use all the time available.

Ask yourself often, How can I do better.

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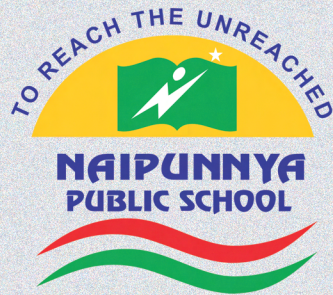
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The Lord Our Shepherd
